About Rosh Hashanah

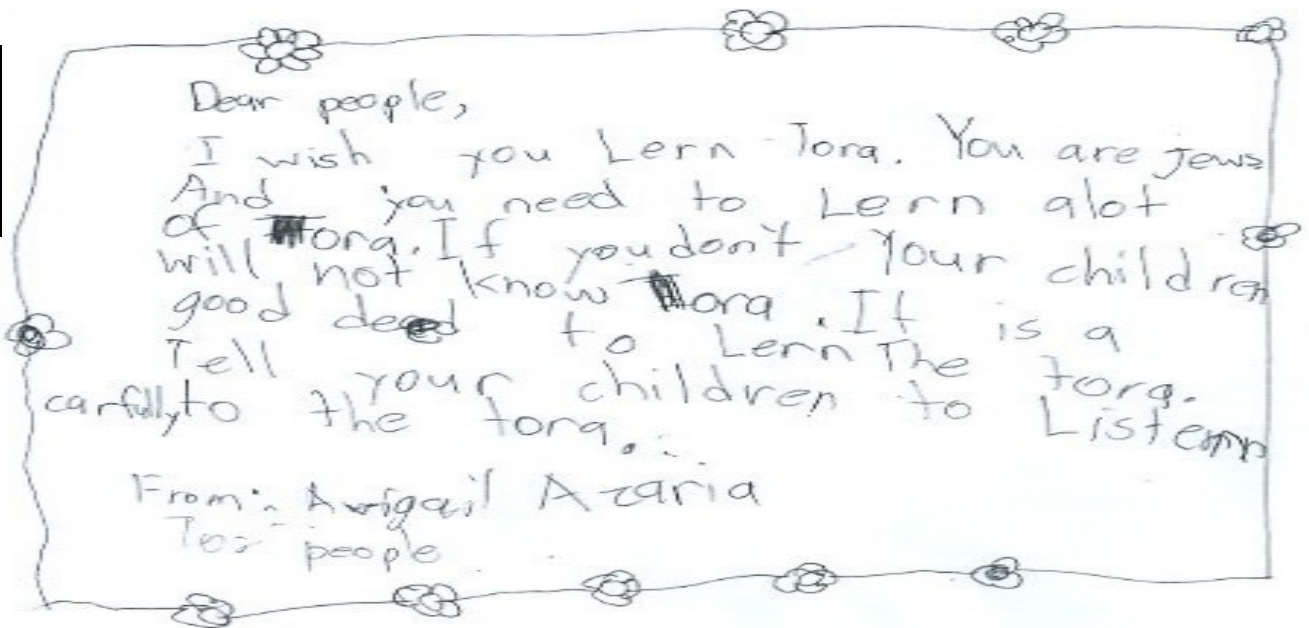
Rosh Hashanah is the Jewish New Year. Rosh Hashanah is the "Day of Judgment" and the Birthday of the World. If we have a sin between you and G-d we pray for his forgiveness and if we have sins against other people we ask for their forgiveness and hope they forgive us. At Rosh Hashanah the Rabbi blows the Shofar, they use a ram's horn in memory of Isaac's sacrifice, the moment Abraham went to sacrifice his son G-d stopped him and he saw a ram which he sacrificed and that's why we use a ram's horn.



DID YOU KNOW???

Rosh Hashanah never falls on a Wednesday, Friday, and Sunday. Are you asking WHY? It's 'cause when the calendar was finally issued by Hillel 2 in 359 C.E., it was so that the holidays would not interfere with the observances.
